TO THE UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE CONFEDERACY:

The undersigned, residing at Pickens, South Carolina who is the grandson of Milton Reese Boggs a Confederate soldier, hereby presents this Certificate of Eligibility for a Southern Cross of Honor. My grandfather entered the service of the Confederate States on the first day of August 1, 1861, as a private in Company B of the 10th S. C. Battalion Cavalry Volunteers, C. S. A. and was at that time a resident of Pickens County, South Carolina. He was killed in the battle of ~~or died from exposure~~, or was honorably discharged from said service ~~as a prisoner of war~~ on the 8th day of May 1865, at which time he held the rank of private.

In securing this Cross of Honor, I solemnly affirm I shall abide by the rules and regulations governing the bestowal of the Cross, and shall under no circumstances either wear it or allow it to be worn.
