The undersigned, residing at Pickens South Carolina who is the daughter of J. B. Neal a Confederate soldier, hereby presents this Certificate of Eligibility for a Southern Cross of Honor My father entered the service of the Confederate States in Spring day of 1861, as a private in Company D of the 9th Regiment

Volunteers C. S. A., and was at that time a resident of Anderson County S.C. He was killed at the battle of or died from exposure, or was honorably discharged from said service by Lee on the ninth day of April (at Appomattox) 1865, at which time he held the rank of private

In securing this Cross of Honor, I solemnly affirm I shall abide by the rules and regulations governing the bestowal of the Cross, and shall under no circumstances either wear it or allow it to be worn.
