The undersigned, residing at Liberty Pickens, Co. S.C., who is an Ex-Confederate Soldier and a member of Camp No.

U. C. Vs., hereby, at your request, presents this Certificate of Eligibility for a Confederate Cross of Honor. He entered the service of the Confederate States on

the day of March 1861, as a Member in Company A of the Benholms Squadron in Virginia or in Jackson Squadron of the 7th S.C. Cavalry Volunteers, Mounted Infantry C. S. A., and was at that time a resident of Pickens County S.C.

He was honorably discharged from said service by at the Surrender at Appomattox, Va. Virginia on the day of 1865, at which time he held the rank of

Hospital Steward of the Regiment, appointed by the Secretary of War
