

## Notice to Chapters of S. C. Division U. D. C.

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Dear Madam President:—

I am sending to you a list of the "Not Registered" and "Names Incomplete" of your chapter members. We want two type-written copies of the member's application paper, regardless of what is on it.

For this purpose we are using the old form of application blanks. Please order the number that you will require for this work from Mrs. J. B. Workman, Ware Shoals, S. C., Registrar of the South Carolina Division, enclose money order or check to pay for blanks and postage on blanks.

In making copies of papers it is very important to copy everything on the original paper, but should the original not give *name or relationship to ancestor, full maiden name and husband's initials of applicant*, see that this is supplied before sending the paper. Please make every effort to supply a paper for every name on the list of "Not Registered". Mark every paper "Old Member".

If a member has been accepted by *demit* have copies of the demit made and if possible secure a copy of the original application paper and attach to the demit.

If a member has affiliated with several chapters, try and trace her membership back to the original chapter. If this takes you out of Division, please attach a type-written note to the demit stating the name of the Division in which her original application is filed.

Following the names of those "Not Registered" you will find, "Papers in file but maiden name or husband's initials missing". Please fill in above *all* lines, giving the missing names, etc. Do this on the *not* registered also.

You will also find—

ON LIST

REGISTERED

"On List" refers to the name which appears on the list prepared by the chapter Treasurer and which we feel *might* be the member for whom we hold a paper—the name given as "Registered".

Have these carefully checked and if the one registered with us is *not* the one "On List" then mark after name "Incorrect". If they are the same, then mark "Correct", but in every instance see that *name in full* is given.

Do not return a chapter list until all information required has been supplied. The Presidents of chapters are responsible for this work. Please begin the work as soon as possible so we may report the South Carolina Division as being one hundred per cent registered at Convention this year.

The necessity of this work was explained at the District Conference.

The General organization insists on a complete registration from all States of every bonifide member of the Daughters of the Confederacy.

Rules for old registration work:

1. Use old form of registration blank, price of blanks 1 cent each.
2. Copies of application must be typewritten, send two copies of each application wanted.
3. Mark every paper "OLD MEMBER".
4. Demit blanks will be furnished free of charge.
5. Chapters are to pay postage when ordering blanks.
6. Begin this work at once.
7. See that all necessary information is supplied.
8. Return list sent you by Division Registrar with the typewritten copies of the papers.
