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Activities begin at Pickens County's Hampton Memorial Library on Thursday, March 12 with computer classes and an Open House in the Historical Room.

Thursday evening at the library, there will be a performance written and performed by local historians and genealogists, entitled "Bad Boys of the Upcountry and the Women Who Loved Them". There is a fee for this event which supports the Birchwood Center for Arts and Folklife.

March Speaker will discuss World War I Museum Exhibit

His presentation will entail the process that led to the development of the exhibit as well as interesting local and national history concerning World War I.

This past summer marked the 100th anniversary of the beginning of World War I. The Pickens County Museum of Art and History commemorated this event by presenting this special exhibit, which included artifacts reflecting America's entry into the war in 1917 through the end of the war in 1918.

The event is spearheaded by Una Welborn, whose husband Harold is descended from Benjamin Barton.

James Standridge, Revolutionary Soldier

The point of research on the Standridge family begins with the Revolutionary Pension records for James and Mary Wallace Standridge, and the 1790 census records in Pendleton District, South Carolina, which later became Pickens and Oconee County. In early family records the name was spelled Standage or Standige, but after the 1800's all branches of the family (with few exceptions) spelled the name Standridge.

James Standridge, son of James Standridge Sr., was born about 1755 in Maryland. James Standridge Sr. first appeared on documents in Rowan County, N.C. In 1768, James, his son was 13 years old. The U.S. and International Marriage Records state that James Standridge and Mary Wallace were married in 1780 in North Carolina and the Pension Records are about 1772 in Rowan, N.C.

He was called on as one of the New Levy or Class or draft for three months in 1777, as well as he recollects, to go against the Cherokee Indians in the fall of the year just at the commencement of frost. He went under General Rutherford, Col. William Thorpe, and Capt. William Morrison. He went out into the Cherokee Nation, was at the towns called Valley Town, Overhill Town and Tellico Plains. He was on the Guard of the Bullock and Provision and was in hearing of the guns and insight of the enemy at the Valley Town where General Williamson and his party fought the Cherokees. He was out on a search when Col. Pickens fought the Indians at the Horse Shoe where they killed many Indians and destroyed their crops.

He served out fully his tour of three months. He returned by way of the French Broad, Swanny, north to the head of the Catawaba. His time expired and he was discharged at Catawaba. He lived in Wilkes County, N.C. when he was called out and returned to the same place after his discharge.

He was afterward called upon in the New Levy service for nine months, he thinks in the month of February 1778, by Capt. John Harden of Col. Dan Thorpe's Regiment and he was out with General Davidson to join the regular army. They met them on the Dan River where there was a considerable army and they continued there for a time. James got sick, was examined and discharged after having been not less than three months out, at this time in the service. He returned to Wilkes County, N.C. and lived there until the close of the war.

In 1796, James Standridge bought 310 acres of land in Pendleton District of South Carolina on the waters of Chauga Creek as follows: Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of ninety pounds of sterling money in hand paid by said Standridge...conveyed and confirmed and by these present doth grant, bargain, convey and confirm unto the said James Standridge, his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or plot ...on Chauga Creek, originally granted to John Perkins...bearing date twenty fourth day of November 1791, now in possession of the said Standridge...three hundred and ten acres. This land was included in the estate of James Standridge at his death.

In August 1807, he bought land as follows: "I Robert Hacket of Pendleton District in the State of South Carolina have granted, bargained and sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said James Standridge all that tract or parcel of land containing two hundred ninety three acres be the same more or less lying on Toxaway Creek, waters of Tugalo River...bounded on all sides by vacant land. Both deeds were written in Pendleton District, S.C. However, Pendleton District was divided into three separate counties, so the deeds are located in Anderson County, S.C.

James Standridge died May 6, 1837 in Pickens County, South Carolina. He did not leave a will, but his property was probated and his youngest son, Isaac was appointed administrator. His personal property was appraised Sept. 21, 1837 and sold Sept. 22, 1837. In addition to the regular household goods, his estate included 5 horses, 17 head of cattle, 2 sheep 17 pigs, a yoke of oxen and five slaves.

The real estate included in the estate was 310 acres on Chauga Creek and 14 acres on Toxaway Creek. The property was valued at less than \$1,000 and was sold Jan. 1, 1838 by the sheriff and proceeds were divided between the heirs.

After the death of James Standridge, his wife Mary made application and received a pension for his service in the war. A letter from the Commissioner of Pensions states: I went with the Ordinary the other day up into the mountains of this District and made out the declaration of Mrs Standridge. She is a resident of the District of South Carolina, aged about eighty four years who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of this provision... She is the widow of James Standridge who was a Private in the War of the Revolution, but she cannot now recollect in whose company or regiment or whether he was drafted or a volunteer. She very well recollects the Revolutionary War and the distress experienced by those who lived in that day and that she and her husband did not escape their share of that trouble and distress. She together with her husband, lived during the war on the Yadkin River in North Carolina and moved about a good deal. She knows that she had two children before the close of the war. Her children's names are Sarah, John, Nelly, Nancy, James, Samuel. Elizabeth, Mary, Joseph, Isaac and Aisey and that their birth stands in the order in which they are written.

Children of James and Mary Standridge

Sarah, born in N.C., married William Roper. Both were dead by 1813.

John, born in N.C., married Sarah Harris in S.C. but moved to Cherokee County, N.C. where all his children were born.

Elenore, born in N.C., married Samuel McBee. She died March 1839 in Marion County, TN.

Nancy, born in S.C., married John Rider. She was dead by 1837 and John moved his family to Lumpkin, GA and later to Montgomery County, AR.

James, born in S.C., first marriage unknown, second wife, Susannah Barr. He moved to Lauderdale County, AL, where his children were born, they later to Pulaski County., AR.

Samuel, born in S.C., married Rebecca Price and lived in Habersham County, GA. Some children moved to AR and AL.

Elizabeth, born in S.C. No further records.

Mary, born in S.C., married Charles Pitts. They raised their family in S.C.

Joseph, born in S.C., married Mary Hall. They raised their family in S.C.

Isaac, born 24 Dec. 1798 in S.C., married first to Hetty, married second to Charlotte Boatright. They raised their family in S.C. After his death, his wife and family moved to Stephens County, GA

Ailsey, born 8 Dec 1799 in S.C., married Allen Downs. She was dead by 1837.



Grave Dedication Ceremony

The ninth National Standridge Family reunion, held in September 2004 in Greenville, South Carolina. The main event at this reunion was the dedication of a marker for Revolutionary Soldier James Standridge. The Joseph Habersham Chapter, Georgia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution presented the program. The service was at Holly Springs Baptist Church, Westminster, Oconee County, South Carolina.

27 April 1841

- The Commissioners of Free Schools met at Pickens C.H. 26th April 1841. Present: Reverend **J.L. Kennedy, William C. Lee, J.A. Doyle, F.N. Garvin & W.L. Keith**
- Resolved that **Reverend J.L. Kennedy** by appointed Chairman pro tem.
- Resolved that the Teachers in attendance to be examined and classed according to their capacity. The following be present were examined and classed as follows to wit With the trustees to each School that was hereafter appointed
 1. **William J. Parsons** Second Class
 2. **Thomas Yaw** Second Class
 3. **Stephen Watson** Second Class
 4. **James Chandler** Second Class
 5. **John A. Moore** Second Class
- Resolved that **T.B. Clayton's** School be located from this date as a 1st Class Teacher with the Trustees heretofore marked.
- Resolved that **T.J. Zachary** School be located from this date 1st Class Teacher at or near **E. Gaines'** and appoint **W.G. Mullinax, E. Gaines** and **Samuel Parsons** Trustees.
- Resolved that **Wm. Fraiser** 2nd Class Teacher School be located at **Holly Spring** and appoint **L. Herndon, E.D. Holland** and **William Burdine** Trustees.
- Resolved that this Board consider that **T.J. Lynix** Report for one quarter to have been heretofore passed.
- Resolved that the following reports be passed in the usual form.
- Resolved that hereafter the Chairman of this Board be not allowed to vote on any question unless there should be a tie in the votes of the other members present.
- Resolved that the Chairman Secretary draw on the Treasurer for the amounts of Reports passed at the present Board together with the amount due **T.F. Lynix**.
- Resolved that this Board stand adjourned till the 4th Monday in July next at 10 o'clock.

July Board 1841

- The Commissioners of Free Schools met at Pickens C.H. 26th July 1841 agreeable to adjournment. Present: Colonel J. Grisham, Reverend J.L. Kennedy, J.B. Reed and W.L. Keith.
- Resolved that the Reports be passed in usual form.
- Resolved that the following Schools be located.
 1. **W.M. Morgan** Second Class. Trustees: **E. Craig, Mat Carson, & Samuel Davis**
 2. **Dennis Hyde** Second Class Trustees: **Saml. McClure, Rt. Boyd & William Syms**
- Resolved that W.L. Keith furnish this Board with the number of children in this District under 5, under 10, under 15 and under 20 to be laid before the Board at its next meeting.
- Resolved that Chair and Secretary draw on the Treasurer for the amount of Reports passed at the present Board.
- Resolved that the Board stand adjourned until the 4th Monday in October next at 10 o'clock.

Pickens Court House, 25th October 1841

- The Commissioners of Free Schools met at Pickens Court House on the 4th Monday the 25th day of October 1841. Present: **J. Grisham, J.L. Kennedy, F.N. Garvin, J.B. Reed and W.L. Keith.**
- Resolved that Reports be passed in the usual form.
- Resolved that **A.S. Bird** have a School located for three months and appoint **T. Howard, John Gary and Rt. Norris**, Trustees.
- Resolved that this Board report to the Legislature at its next Session the number of children in Pickens District from 5 years to 20 years of age who are fit recipients to be taught by the public, believing that one third of the number in the District are which numbers we ascertain to be.
- Resolve that the Chair and Secretary make a Report to the Legislature.
- Resolved that the Chair and Secretary draw on the Treasurer for amount of Reports passed at the present Board.
- Resolved that this Board stand adjourned until the 4th Monday in January 1842 at 10 o'clock.

Pickens Court House, January 24 1842

- The Commissioners of Free School for Pickens District met at Pickens Court House on the 24th day of January 1842. Present: **J. Grisham, J.L. Kennedy, J.A. Doyle, Wm. C. Lee, F.N. Garvin, J.B. Reed and W.L. Keith.**
- Resolved that the Board go into elections for Chairman and Secretary for the present year.
- **Rev. J. Grisham** was elected Chairman and **W.L. Keith**, Secretary.
